7 Facts About Sociopaths

- 1. The terms "sociopath" and "psychopath" are often used interchangeably. A related term is antisocial personality disorder. The American Psychiatric Association has suggested changing the name again to "Antisocial/Psychopathic Type."
- 2. Sociopaths do not have a conscience, and they do not form emotional bonds with other people. This means they can do absolutely anything without feeling any guilt or remorse.
- 3. Sociopaths are social predators. They are fluent liars and brazen con artists. Most are manipulative and some are violent, but only a tiny percentage are serial killers.
- 4. Sociopathy is not a mental illness; it is a personality disorder. The condition is highly genetic.
- 5. Approximately 1 percent to 4 percent of the population are sociopaths. That means there may be 3 to 12 million sociopaths in the United States.
- 6. Sociopaths can be found in all segments of society—rich, poor, male, female, all races, all communities. They often blend easily into society.
- 7. Sociopaths, once they are adults, cannot be rehabilitated.
